

- Cabinet approves Vigyan Dhara scheme with outlay of Rs 10,579 crore
 - The proposed outlay for Vigyan Dhara is ₹ 10,579 crore during the 15th Finance Commission period from 2021-22 to 2025-26, Information and Broadcasting Minister Ashwini Vaishnaw told reporters. The scheme has three broad components -- science and technology institutional and human capacity building; research and development; and innovation, technology development and deployment. - Plunging MGNREGA work demand reflects rise in rural income There is a revival in construction activities in both urban and rural areas which has led to less demand for work under MGNREGA,". - Kharif area up 2% on year, paddy rises 4.3%
 - The current crop area is 97% of the normal sown area. Sowing of paddy (4.29%), pulses (5.7%) and oilseeds (0.5%) saw increases because of normal to above-normal monsoon rains in key growing states in central, eastern and southern regions. The agriculture ministry has set a target of record food grains production of 340 MT during the 2024-25 crop year (July-June), 3.4% higher than 328.8 MT estimated during the previous crop year.
