



• Cabinet approves Rs 10,103-crore edible oil mission To reduce import dependence and achieve self-sufficiency on edible oil, the Cabinet on Thursday approved the National Mission on Edible Oils with an outlay of Rs 10,103 crore, The scheme is aimed at boosting oil seeds production from the current level of 12.7 million tonne (MT) to 20.2 MT by 2031. The mission will focus on enhancing the production of key oilseeds — rapeseed mustard, groundnut, soybean, sunflower, and Sesamum. Read More...

Moderate hike in wheat MSP likely

The government is likely to announce a 5% increase in the minimum support price (MSP) of wheat, a key rabi crop for the next marketing season 2025-26 (April-June), to Rs 2400/quintal, taking into consideration market availability and global prices of the commodity. Read More...

- 75 infra projects launched of BRO worth Rs. 2,236 crore
 Defence Minister inaugurated 75 transformative infrastructure projects of the BRO.
 These projects are worth Rs 2,236 crore and are spread across 11 states and UTs. Among
 the projects inaugurated, there are 22 roads and 51 bridges. Nineteen of these projects
 are in Jammu & Kashmir, 18 in Arunachal Pradesh, 11 in Ladakh, nine in Uttarakhand,
 six in Sikkim, five in Himachal Pradesh, two each in West Bengal and Rajasthan and one
 each in Nagaland, Mizoram and Andaman & Nicobar Islands. Read More...
- RoDTEP scheme extended by a year, rates lowered The government has extended the period of its flagship export promotion scheme Remission of Duties and Taxes on Exported Products (RoDTEP) for a year till September 30, 2025 but revised the rates downwards so that the outgo remains within the budgetary allocation. The lower rates may mean that tax remission for exporters is not full, and could hit them at a time shipments are facing a slowdown. Read More...
- Exporters don't need RCMC to avail RoSCTL, RoDTEP, etc.

The government has clarified that exporters are not required to obtain Registration-Cum-Membership Certificate (RCMC) for claiming benefits under the post-export remission-based schemes such as Rebate of State and Central Taxes and Levies (RoSCTL), Remission of Duties and Taxes on Export Products (RoDTEP) and duty drawback.
