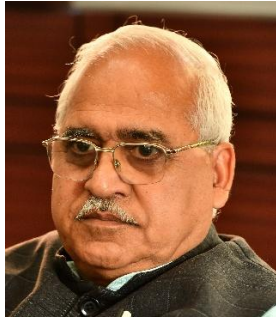
Intellectual Leadership and Outreach

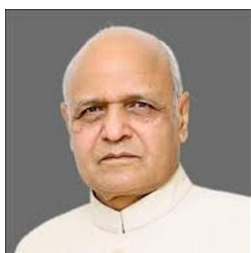

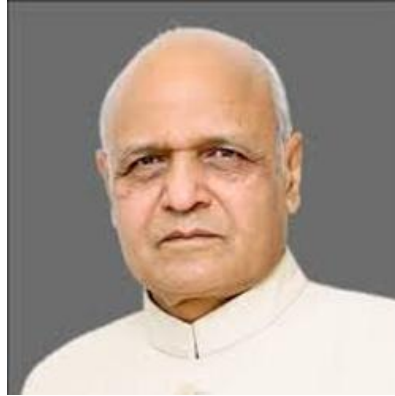

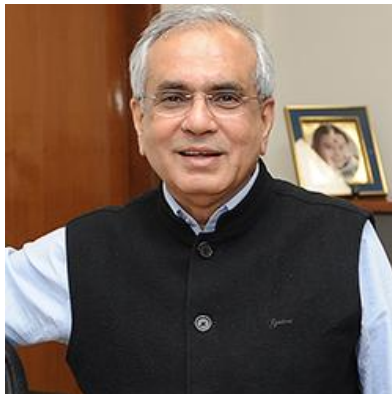

ACTIVITIES of 2025-2026

International Conference

The International Conference on “Vision 2047: Prosperous and Great Bharat”, Kurukshetra University, Haryana Agriculture University, Indira Gandhi National tribal University, Amarkantak, and ICAR, was convened from April 24 to 26, 2025.



- Brought together 2400+ participants, 92+ speakers, and 700+ research papers across 10 plenaries and 19 technical sessions.

This high-level summit was a collaborative endeavor organized by Swadeshi Shodh Sansthan, Kurukshetra University (KUK), Chaudhary Charan Singh Haryana Agricultural University (CCSHAU), Hisar, and the Indian Council of Agricultural Research (ICAR). The event drew

international and academic expertise from the University of Agder (Norway), Indira Gandhi National Tribal University Amarkantak, the Association of Indian Universities (AIU), and Organiser Magazine, creating a global platform to chart India's path toward a \$30 trillion economy by its independence centenary.

This transition ensures that the "Vision 2047" spirit remains a living project, bridging the gap between historical heritage and the industrial demands of a future global leader.

- **Heritage-Inspired Tech:** Exploring how Vedic Mathematics can decode modern cryptography and how Matrika Vidya (linguistic genius) can inspire localised AI natural language tools.
- **Democratizing Tech:** Moving away from English-only models toward regional AI interfaces to empower the 22 official languages of Bharat.
- **Startup Ecosystem:** A collective goal was set to foster 1,000 new unicorns by localising innovative ideas and globalising their execution.

Harnessing the Demographic Dividend

With 65% of the population under the age of 35, the summit prioritised turning 900 million youth into an economic engine.

- The Drone Didi Model: CM Naib Singh Saini highlighted this flagship program, which trains rural women as drone pilots for precision farming, increasing yields by 30% and creating decentralized employment.
- Education Reform: Prof. Raj Kumar Goel and A.S. Mittal called for industry-co-designed curricula and modular online platforms to ensure that degrees translate directly into employability within the \$10 trillion rural economy.

By highlighting the importance of research, development, and flexibility, the seminar reinforced that profitability in the startup space is achievable through honest customer engagement and a commitment to quality.

- *On 26/03/2026, Moments from an inspiring evening at Gyan Kunj. We had the privilege of hosting Shri Suresh Soni Ji for a deep dive into the philosophy of Swadeshi.*



From discussing the historical "Sone ki Chidiya" to the modern need for equitable growth, the conversation was a masterclass in civilizational wisdom. ***Quote of the day:*** ***"Sustainable consumption is the path to equitable growth."*** Reflecting on the impact of colonialism, Soni Ji explained how the British systematically dismantled India's sophisticated systems to transition the nation from a prosperous "Sone ki Chidiya" to a looted economy. He emphasized that in Indian civilization, Vigyan (Science), Kala (Art), and Adhyatma (Spirituality) were never compartmentalized but were harmoniously integrated into daily life. He concluded by invoking the Vedic principle of "Tyah Purvak Bhog Karo," suggesting that true progress is achieved when consumption is balanced with restraint and ecological sacrifice. LECTURE SERIES

We organise a fortnightly lecture series designed to spark dialogue and bridge the gap between academic research and practical implementation, ensuring that theoretical insights are translated into real-world impact.

- ***On 02/02/2026, Global Outlook & Bharat Vertical of Swadeshi Shodh Sansthan successfully organised an engaging lecture on “Bharat’s BRICS Presidency.***



Shaping Global South Leadership in a Multipolar World.” Lecture highlights the Beyond talk shop, tangible outcomes, and member nations in the Global South delivery imperative. Interactive discourse, students, researchers, and policy enthusiasts dissected strategic autonomy, global leadership, and the future of multilateralism. Reflective conclusion reaffirmed cooperation, resilient democratic, equitable world order, SSS Bharat-centric international affairs discourse commitment. Outcomes: BRICS-aligned research, Global Outlook vertical 50 policy briefs, MEA NITI Aayog, 20 universities, and international relations departments. Complements Vision 2047 global outlook values pillar non-defeatable defense, S&T leadership, largest economy positioning Bharat UNSC permanent seat, G20 troika leadership. Strategic multilateralism prevents Western hegemony, rooted in Panchsheel NAM Vasudhaiva Kutumbakam, sustainable, inclusive trajectory.

- ***On 20/01/2026, The Unbeatable Defence Structure Vertical of Swadeshi Shodh Sansthan successfully organised an engaging lecture on India's Strategic and Military Dimensions by Lt Gen V.K. Chaturvedi.***



He outlined key drivers of India's security framework, including strategic autonomy, defence indigenisation, perception management through continuous dialogue (manthan and chintan), jointness amongst forces, technological advancement across the Indian Military, and maintaining a well-trained and well-equipped military even in peacetime. He acknowledged political stability under strong leadership while cautioning that national existence itself can be threatened if complacency sets in. He stressed the need for technology development, multi-front contingencies, and logistics resilience. He discussed issues such as the National Register of Citizens (NRC) from a national security perspective and reiterated the importance of Atmanirbharta (self-reliance). He urged citizens to actively exercise and strengthen national capabilities. He concluded his address with the patriotic poem:

“Utho dhara ke veer sapooton,

Punah naya nirman karo.”

- ***On 13/12/2025, Swadeshi Shodh Sansthan organised a workshop on “Developing AI and Digital Skills for Effective Research” at Gyankunj, New Delhi, led by Dr. Deepak Bishla.***



He explained AI’s expanding role in research, covering AGI, ASI, the Turing Test, and evolving human–machine challenges. Dr. Bishla also highlighted applications like CNNs in restoring ancient texts while stressing ethical and secure use of AI. A significant portion of the workshop was dedicated to practical demonstrations, where Dr. Bishla demystified the inner workings of AI. By illustrating the mechanics of Convolutional Neural Networks (CNNs), he showcased how these tools are uniquely equipped to identify patterns and restore damaged ancient texts, effectively digitizing India’s historical legacy with unprecedented accuracy. Beyond theory, the session provided hands-on training on how to use AI effectively for research. Dr. Bishla demonstrated "prompt engineering" and data validation techniques, ensuring researchers could leverage AI as a sophisticated assistant rather than a replacement for human intellect. Throughout these demonstrations, he maintained a strong emphasis on the ethical and secure use of technology, warning against the risks of data bias and the erosion of intellectual property. By empowering researchers with these digital skills, the workshop reinforced the Sansthan’s mission to build a Self-Reliant Bharat that is technologically advanced yet remains deeply rooted in ethical, indigenous values.

- **On 10/12/2025, the Full Employment Vertical of Swadeshi Shodh Sansthan successfully organised an engaging lecture on “Employment: Role of Entrepreneurship in India”. Prof. Arvind Kumar.**



Leveraging his expertise from JNU and Stanford, delivered a compelling discourse on the evolving employment landscape in India. The lecture provided practical insights into the startup ecosystem, covering concepts such as the Minimum Viable Product (MVP), navigating early-stage hurdles, and accessing diverse funding sources. Prof. Kumar highlighted the importance of overcoming the fear of failure, using real-world success stories such as Physics Wallah and Lenskart to illustrate the power of identifying market gaps. He encouraged the audience to "start small, think big," a mantra that aligns with the Sansthan’s mission of indigenous economic empowerment and Swadeshi ka Utkarsh.

- **On 03/12/2025 Swadeshi Shodh Sansthan's Bharatiya Life Value System vertical hosted Prof. Balaganapathi Devarakonda's lecture on “Ātmanirbhartā and Strategic Autonomy.”**



He framed self-reliance in Indian philosophy as a moral-spiritual rather than economic concept. He emphasized two core pillars: Metaphysics: Understanding one’s purpose and existence. Ethics: Acting with moral responsibility. The Subjective Self: Modern systems often treat humans as objects. Prof. Devarakonda advocated for philosophy in education to help individuals think, decide, and live wisely. Vedic & Scriptural Wisdom: Citing the Bhagavad Gita, he noted that we must "raise ourselves by

ourselves," as inner discipline is the precursor to liberty. He also referenced Kabir to illustrate that every individual, like a needle or a sword, has a unique and dignified role. Redefining Equality: True equality is not about identity but about respecting the inherent value of every person, regardless of wealth or status. The Path to National Autonomy. The talk concluded by defining Strategic Autonomy as a psychological and spiritual awakening. Prof. Devarakonda urged a shift from "essential dependence" to reducing "non-essential dependence" by producing what we are capable of within our borders. Echoing Mahatma Gandhi, he reminded the audience that self-reliance is not about "having more," but about "being more."

- ***On 25/09/2025 “Research & Innovation Ecosystem Development” fosters collaboration between innovators and researchers, by Dr. Sapna Poti.***

The event explored Punjab’s civilizational depth, its spiritual heritage, and its urgent contemporary crises, linking the region’s ancient identity to its present social and economic struggles. The address also dealt with radicalism, identity politics, and the drug problem. Prof. Kumar argued that separatist currents, diaspora-based identity mobilisation, and social media have kept the threat of radicalism alive, even if its electoral strength remains limited. He identified drug addiction as one of Punjab’s most damaging social crises, rooted in geography, cross-border trafficking, family disruption, economic distress, and political or administrative complicity. He presented these problems as interconnected rather than separate, with agrarian decline sitting at the centre of the crisis.

- ***On 10/07/2025 Beyond the Rivers: Time to Rethink the Indus Waters Treaty Talk by Shri Sanjay Kundu, Former DGP, Himachal Pradesh, Organised by Swadeshi Shodh Sansthan (Global Outlook and Bharat).***



Highlight: In a time of mounting water stress, demographic pressure, and emerging geo-strategic realities, the Swadeshi Shodh Sansthan took a decisive step forward by organising a seminar titled “Beyond the Rivers: Time to Rethink the Indus Waters Treaty (IWT) on 10th July 2025. The event aimed to spark a national debate around the

re-evaluation of the IWT, a treaty signed in 1960 under the aegis of the World Bank between Bharat and Pakistan. The seminar concluded with a powerful message: The Indus Waters Treaty is not a divine commandment; it's a dated document. India must initiate a new discourse, assert its upper riparian rights, and address internal water needs through a Swadeshi vision of hydro-sovereignty. As we move towards Vision 2047, realigning our national water policy and reclaiming our rightful share is not just a strategic necessity; it is a civilizational imperative.

- ***On 19/06/2025 India's Operation Sindoor: China's Involvement with Pakistan, Organised by Swadeshi Shodh Sansthan (China Desk), Prof. Srikant Kondapalli.***



Kondapalli masterfully deconstructed the April 22, 2025, Pahalgam terrorist carnage, long-term meticulously orchestrated terror satellite phones receiving Chinese satellite signals active 23 months, regional surveillance. India's May 67 Operation Sindoor precision-restrained strikes neutralized perpetrators, civilians avenged without escalation. New Delhi press conference signaled calibrated response, contrasting the Russia-Ukraine morass, three years unresolved. The session on national security and hydro-sovereignty provided a critical analysis of the China-Pakistan axis, exposing Beijing's diplomatic hypocrisy and its dominance over 81 percent of Pakistan's defense exports. A key focus was India's strategic narrative lapse, with experts noting that Pakistan has unleashed 9 million propaganda videos to dominate the digital domain. To counter this, the panel urged a shift toward narrative warfare and technological nationalism.

- ***On 13/06/2025 From Gunpower to Algorithms: Evolution in Warfare A Special Talk by Lt Gen (Dr) PC Nair, PVSM, AVSM, YSM Organised by Swadeshi Shodh Sansthan (Defence and Security Vertical).***



A riveting timeline of ancient trebuchets, basic gunpowder, medieval cannons, revolvers, nuclear fission, post-WWII armored tanks, drones, UAVs, culminating in AI-enabled swarms. This evolution mirrors Bharat's own defense journey from 1962 lessons to 2025 Sindoor triumphs, underscoring swadeshi necessity. Modern warfare, asymmetric nonstate actors, civilian entanglements, economic sabotage, social media psyops, and endless conflicts like Ukraine. Emerging perils: hypersonic gliders, cyber intrusions, national organizational vulnerabilities, trade disruptions, diplomatic manipulations, algorithm warfare, automated targeting, AI decisions ethicallegal minefields. Nair emphasized AI revolution. Weapons don't sleep, transcending human fatigue, delivering real-time friend-foe discrimination, autonomous ISR kinetic, and nonkinetic strikes. Core domains: military AI strategy, big data analytics, ISR, kinetic ops, cloud scalability, IoT fusion. IoMT integrates tactical operational strategic echelons, smart soldier augments battlefield transparency splitsecond calls.

- ***On 06/06/2025 "Indian Armed Forces at a Glance" was conducted by Swadeshi Shodh Sansthan (Defence and Security Vertical).***



Featuring the distinguished speaker Col. Ashutosh Kumar (Retd.). Col. Kumar navigated through the evolving dynamics of national security, highlighting the strategic synergy between the Army, Navy, and Air Force. Key discussions centred on:

- ***Modernisation & Self-Reliance:*** *The transition toward Aatmanirbharta (self-reliance) in defence manufacturing.*
- ***Geopolitical Challenges:*** *Addressing contemporary threats and the importance of tactical readiness in a multipolar world.*
- ***Technological Integration:*** *The role of AI and advanced surveillance in modern warfare.*

The session served as a vital platform for scholars and enthusiasts to understand the grit and sophistication behind India's borders.

- ***On 20/05/2025 Influence of Indian Civilisation on China: Insights from Prof. B. R. Deepak's Lecture, Organised by Swadeshi Shodh Sansthan (China Desk).***



Deepak traced intellectual corridors: Takshashila, Nalanda, Vikramashila nurtured medicine, math, astronomy, and exporting via the Silk Road, and pilgrims. Epics like the Mahabharata echoed in Chinese lore; the Arthashastra was named "Chinabhumi." Buddhism's 35,000+ Sanskrit loans reshaped Chinese phonology, birthing Chan (Zen) and genres like bianwen from Jataka tales Qu Yuan's cosmology mirroring Indian motifs. Natyashastra birthed Chinese theatre; sugar tech flowed eastward. Archaeology from Lopnor idols to Quanzhou shrines affirms imprints. Post-lecture Q&A dissected modern implications: Rekindle dialogue via shared roots, countering border tensions with Taiping-era solidarity. Deepak urged policy: Sanskrit-China studies chairs, cultural exchanges reviving Kalapa trade. Satish Kumar Ji linked to swadeshi: Civilizational pride fuels self-reliance.
